Sentosa Beaches at a Glance

Aside from its many tourist attractions, Sentosa's beaches are certainly worth visiting - and affordable too. Both Siloso and Palawan beaches offer attractions and amenities suitable for families.

Entry to Sentosa via car is \$2 per person and \$2 per vehicle. Upon entering, drive straight to the sheltered parking garage situated right by the beach. Parking is only \$1 per entry. Then take the escalator up to the beach. You can hop on the beach tram to get to various parts of Siloso or Palawan Beach. Larger strollers may not fit too well in the trams. Try the front row of seats and ask staff to assist you with the stroller if necessary. The buses are a tad more stroller-friendly than the trams with its wider doors.

If you plan your beach visit in the afternoon, you can stay for the Songs of the Sea show which is also located here.

1. Siloso Beach

You will see many teens and young adults playing beach volleyball at Siloso Beach. There are also restaurants and eateries that provide alfresco dining. The Flying Trapeze attraction is opened from Tuesday to Friday from 4pm to 6pm and from 4pm to 7pm on weekends and public holidays. Children must be four years and above to try it. It costs \$10 per swing or \$20 for three swings.

2. Animal Encounters at Palawan

Upon arriving at Palawan Beach, you'll hear animal noises, especially loud bird chirping at the Animal Encounters. There are three

shows at the Amphitheatre (at 12.30pm, 3.30pm, and 5pm) and other scheduled "animal encounter" opportunities for beach goers. The shows are free and make great entertainment for kids. The path to the Amphitheatre is also stroller-friendly.

3. Palawan Beach

Palawan Beach is perhaps the most family-friendly beach on Sentosa with a Koufu foodcourt and a 7-Eleven that sells food and snacks at affordable prices.

4. Southernmost Point of Continental Asia

Not to be missed, take a stroll with baby in arms or in a carrier across the narrow wooden bridge to the Southernmost Point of Continental Asia.

5. Song of the Sea Show

End your day off at the Songs of the Sea show that includes spectacular lights, water, pyrotechnics, music, and live actors. The story and the changing special effects will captivate both young and old. When you arrive at the entry gate, tell the staff you wish to enter via the designated gates that will allow you to wheel your stroller to the front of the seating area. Tickets to the show are priced at \$8 per person. It's a great show to watch with the whole family, grandparents included. When you park at Beach Station, the escalator from the car park leads you right to the ticket counter. You can also hop on both beach trams to get to the show. Alight at Beach Station.
