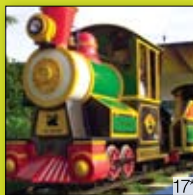

Escape Theme Park at a glance

Escape Theme Park is a family entertainment haven providing a variety of thrill rides and carnival games suitable for both children (above 3-years-old) and adults. It is also well facilitated with fast food outlets, finger food stalls, a retail shop, lockers (at \$2), a guest relations office for pram deposit and free rental of strollers and umbrellas, a first aid office, and toilets equipped with diaper changing corners and kiddy potties. Did we mention it's also smoke-free?

There are up to 16 rides to choose from but these are subjected to height criteria depending on the nature of the ride. However, activities are limited for children under three-years-old. Persons who are pregnant, have heart problems, or have undergone surgery recently should refrain from the rides altogether.

The amusement park operates only on weekends (10am to 8pm), school vacations, and gazetted public holidays. Entrance fee costs \$8.90 for children from 3- to 12-years-old, \$17.70 for adults, and free for children below 3-years-old and senior citizens above 55. A \$42.80 family pass will admit two adults and two children. Union members enjoy a special rate.

1. Kiddy Rides

Parents can belt up young children for kiddy rides on battery operated bikes and cars in an enclosed area near the entrance. Maximum height: 1m.

2. Flipper

How would you like spinning as if you were in a dryer? If that is your idea of excitement then the

Flipper is your choice ride. Enjoy a swirl and whirl, and dip and rise to a height of 13.5m in an UFO saucer in just minutes! Minimum height: 1.4m.

3. Kite Flyer

What's it like to fly like Superman? Experience it at the Kite Flyer when you dash through the air suspended only by a shoulder harness. Mind the flying shoes! Children under 1.1m must be accompanied by an adult.

4. Haunted

Welcome to the dark side! Hear the screams of terror even before you cross the bridge to the realm of the haunted where all things eerie and ghastly exist. Haunted is not one for the fainthearted! Children below 7-years-old must be accompanied by an adult.

5. Ferris Wheel

Up, up, and away in the Ferris Wheel! Hop on in for an uplifting ride in this hot air balloon-looking capsule that takes up to four pax. Children under 1.1m must be accompanied by an adult.

6. Rainbow

Somewhere over the Rainbow, things can get a little woozy when you are being hoisted nine storeys high. Minimum height: 1.52m. Children between 1.25m and 1.51m must be accompanied by an adult.

7. Daytona Beginner Track / Go-kart

Belt up for some full throttle action at the Daytona circuit! A double-seater go-kart can take a child passenger (between 1m and 1.47m) and an adult driver on the Beginner track. Experienced go-karters can skip to the next level at the Go-Kart

track. All drivers must be at least 18-years-old and 1.47m tall.

8. Pirate Ship

All aboard the Pirate Ship! Hoy! Now hold on to the safety bar and scream your lungs out as you are taken on a Viking voyage that will plough the air in gradually sharper angles, forward and backward. Minimum height: 1.2m.

9. Wet and Wild

What do you expect from a ride call Wet and Wild? Why, getting wet from all that splash-splash and wild from the roller coaster ride about the five-storey high flumes of course! We hope you brought an extra change of clothes though. You can also buy a poncho (\$2) at the retail shop. Minimum height: 1.2m.

10. Inverter

With a name like Inverter, you know this ride is going to spin you like a fast-forwarded clockwork and turn your world upside down. Minimum height: 1.2m.

11. Red Baron

Not quite a stealth fighter jet but nonetheless the Red Baron is a great way for junior to experience a day in the life of a pilot. Fasten your seatbelt! Minimum height: 1.1m.

12. Family Coaster

Don't be fooled by the colourful train carriages of the Family Coaster. The ride promises to take the whole family through a twisted affair of railway that meanders high up above ground. Best seats are in the front or last carriage. Children below 1.1m must be accompanied by an adult.

13. Remote Control Boats

For \$1, anyone can be a captain of a yacht. Maneuver the vessel using a remote steering wheel and watch it take to the water like a fish. The kids will love it.

14. Bumper Boat

Fire away at unsuspecting opponents while on a bumper boat ride and make them soaking wet! That said, you should have an extra change of clothes on hand. Children below 1m must be accompanied by an adult who is at least 1.1m tall.

15. Central Pavilion

Averaging \$2.50 per game, children can compete in games like Ring Toss, Hoops, or the all-time favourite, Roll-A-Ball, all happening at the Central Pavilion. Enjoy a free game when you purchase a \$10 funkey! card. This card can be used like a cashcard elsewhere in the Theme Park, except at fast food restaurants. A coin changing machine is located next to the Scatter Ball booth. Halal finger food is also available from \$1.50 onwards.

16. Revolution

This is not a rough and tumble ride but one which is certainly crazy and revolutionary! Imagine being spun around first clockwise then anti-clockwise at speeds unimaginable. Those with motion sickness might think twice attempting the Revolution. Minimum height: 1.2m.

17. Choo Choo Train

After all that euphoric thrills, why not slow down for a leisurely family ride on the Choo Choo Train to end the day? Blow the whistle and off you weave in and about the greenery now! Children below 1.1m must be accompanied by an adult.
